

- Amended in 2006, 2009, and 2019
- Includes list of redevelopment activities (projects)
- Advisory Committee formed

FUNDING


- Funded by Tax Increment Financing (TIF)
- Based on taxable value of properties within CRA
- Capture growth of ad valorem tax revenues within CRA
 - Taxes frozen at base year of CRA establishment (1998)

Incremental growth of taxes in subsequent years (TIF) is used to fund

projects


 Dedicate those funds to specific improvements within CRA










GUIDING OBJECTIVES


- Land use must complement transportation policy

 Land use and transportation system must be coordinated to assure connectivity and mobility for residents, employees, employees, employers, and visitor populations










TIF GROWTH RATES

- Historic: tax increment growth rate (1999-2019)= 13.3%
- Projected: tax increment growth rates (2020-2040) =
 - ■Low Scenario:

 - 4.1%






TIF PROJECTIONS THROUGH 2040

- Extend sunset date by 12 years to 2040
- Low Scenario: average annual contribution to Trust Fund = \$26,954,500
- Medium Scenario: average annual contribution to Trust Fund = \$29,548,800
- High Scenario: average annual contribution to Trust Fund = \$32,720,700

SUMMARY

- True to the original 1998 Redevelopment Plan in keeping transportation a cornerstone element
- Ability to expand resource allocation through extending sunset date
- TIF Projections allow for adequate availability of resources to meet all expected needs
- Consider a revenue cap which would allow funds to be available to return to the General Fund
- Provides reliable financial resource that supports the County and Region
